As time went on the next challenge came, grandchildren, nine of them: Michael, Karissa, Kassandra, Ariana, Domenic, Nicholas, Anna Marie, Alyssa and Gabriella. There were several four pawed and furry grand pets.

Upon retirement Angie didn't slow down, only Raytheon was now out of the equation. Somehow Angie, Josie and I had time for dinners out, trips to the Conn. casinos and a couple of trips to Florida. Prior to Josie's and my retirement, Angie and Josie had their weekly shopping and lunch Tuesdays. When we moved to Chelmsford, Angie was there to help us pack and move. Angie was always there to help others, but she always wanted to do things herself. She hardly ever wanted to bother anyone with her problems, much to our dismay. Josie and I wanted to give back to her somehow. Even when Angie took ill when we would visit she would want to tend to her guests: coffee, drinks, pastries, etc.

Finally, on the last weeks of her life, Josie and I, as well as her children and grandchildren, were finally able to begin to pay her back for her many years of love and kindness. During this time the scene of Josie holding Angie's hand as she laid in bed for hours on end are indelibly etched in my mind.

Angie left us gently on Monday October 9th and left a huge void.

Love is sometimes given unconditionally and not always returned adequately.
