She was the bingo queen. She loved snowmen and apple scented candles. She never met a candy she couldn't store in her bra for later. She had great teeth until they got lost. She'd flirt with everyone. She only drank iced tea. She laughed so much she often peed her pants. [T T T T] [SEP SEP]

We'll miss her stories and her sporadic use of French. She hasn't been able to dance these past couple years, but one thing we know for sure is that wherever she is there's country music playing and she's dancing. [T T T T] [SEP SEP]
