September 25, 1918 - October 25, 2014

Harry A. Mavrogeorge, Sr., 96, of Litchfield, died Saturday October 25, 2014 at St. Joseph Hospital in Nashua.

He was born September 25, 1918 in Norfolk, VA son of the late Alexander and Maria (Varkis) Mavrogeorge. Harry was also predeceased by his wife, Aspasia (Lenton) Mavrogeorge in 2000.
