John Francis Baronas, 77, of Hudson, NH and formerly of N. Billerica, MA, died June 16, 2020 at Massachusetts General Hospital in Boston, MA following a brief illness.

That's what I think of my dad, John Baronas.

Dad was never flashy, arrogant or concerned about what others thought of him. He was kind, calm and loving. His focus was his family which is what any child would hope for in a father.

He served his country honorably during the Cuban missile crisis, was a solid friend to his fellow soldiers and made lifetime friendships during his time in the Air Force.

After the service, he showed up day after day to his job as a package driver and later a tractor trailer driver for United Parcel Service. He gave his company over 30 years of solid service. His job allowed him to provide for his family and take us on vacations and other adventures. One of my earliest and fondest memories was of him coming home after a long day of work with candy or treats in his lunch box. Just that simple act reinforced his love for his children and showed he thought of us day in and day out.

He was a true partner to my Mom for 54 years of marriage. They complimented each other and always made me and Jim feel loved and valued. He would do whatever was needed for his family, even after a long day of work. Dishes to be dried, something to be fixed, or lawn care and other yard chores. He set a perfect example for my brother and I on what it is to be part of a family and the head of a household.

Mom made sure we did our schoolwork, helped with chores and behaved as best we could. If we screwed up, you would not hear any ranting or raving. Dad earned respect by his example to us. The most we'd get would be "I'm very disappointed in you", which would snap you out of your tantrum and make you re-examine how you behaved.

Dad always found time to attend my high school football games, award ceremonies, Boy Scout trips and encouraged my brother Jim in his passion for music. He stressed the importance of education and treating people the way you'd want to be treated. Dad supported us quietly and consistently.

I will never forget our time in the basement family room cheering on the Bruins and the ups and downs of every season. He taught Jim and I the how to be a solid person and a good husband and friend. There is no greater gift than your relationship with your father. I'm thankful God gave me and my brother him for a role model.

While I am despondent at the loss of my father, I find myself already affected by memories of him. Things that would make me angry, or frustrated are now much less important. I find myself thinking about Dad, his calm demeanor and his unflappable steadiness of personality. I thank God every day for his guidance, love and gentle ways.

I can think of no other way to thank him other than to continue to try and live up to the standard he set as a father, husband and friend. I pray my daughters and wife feel the same support and love that he provided to my brother and mother.

God Bless You Dad. Please continue to watch over us and protect us.
