Raynald Dubord, 81, passed away peacefully Saturday, July 18th, 2020 after a long illness. Ray is the loving husband of Ginette (Laurendeau) Dubord with whom he spent 55 years of marriage.

Ray was born in La Guadeloupe, Quebec, Canada to the late Gedeon and Florence (Ferland) Dubord. He was a devout Catholic and communicant of St. John the Evangelist Church in Hudson, NH.

A proud member of the Carpenter's Union for over thirty years, Ray's contributions can be found in many of the most famous buildings in Boston, including the Prudential Center, Mass General, and the John Hancock Tower. Ray was able to pass his trade, talents, and work ethic to his son Robert. Ray looked forward to time with his children, whether it was working side by side with Robert, watching Jimmy ski, or teaching his daughter Michele about history and political science. Ray inspired each of his children to follow their dreams, seek an education, and to always keep laughing. But mostly, he taught them to not ever take away someone's livelihood, to always show up, and to never burn bridges because you never know when you may have to cross them again.

Ray spent his final years happily at Bedford Hills Center, where his laughter and jokes would ring down the halls. He loved having his Dunkin' Donuts Iced Coffee and especially Chinese food and ice cream.
