Sandra Jean (Shaw) Meyerhoefer Age 77 of Hudson, NH died September 26, 2020 after a brief illness.

She also enjoyed knitting, book club, crossword, sudoku, and jigsaw puzzles. She was a member of the Beta Sigma Phi sorority, Laureate Iota chapter.
