He loved to travel with Robyn, and they were recently given the opportunity to travel to Ireland, his bucket list trip. He loved vacations in such places as Aruba, the Bahamas, Mexico, Florida and California with his family and friends. His love of classic cars was something that never changed, and he was gifted with one of his favorites this summer, a 1975 Chevy Corvette, which he loved to take rides in!

Brian is survived by his wife, Robyn (Turcotte) McClelland. 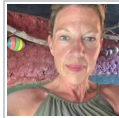
