Brian R. McMahon, 52 of Nashua, died Saturday, August 22, 2009 at UMass Medical Memorial Hospital in Worcester, MA.

He was born May 4, 1957 in Nashua, son of Muriel (Bonnette) McMahon of Milford and the late John A. McMahon.

Brian was the husband of Cheryl (Barrett) McMahon of Nashua with whom he shared 20 years of marriage.

He was motorcycle enthusiast and enjoyed riding all over New England with his son on the back and his dear brother and friends at his side. Brian loved classic cars and enjoyed tinkering on them, especially his 1972 LTD Convertible. He was also an avid golfer.

Brian was employed with Nashua Corp. for 27 years and was recently employed with Elm Street Jr., High School as a custodian, a position which he took great pride in. He was also an occasional lector at Parish of the Resurrection, of which he was a parishioner.
