Harold August Williams, 88, passed away peacefully at his home in Hudson, New Hampshire on Monday, November 7, 2022.

Harold was born on December 18, 1933 in New York, NY to the late August Williams and Emma (Kettler) Williams. He was predeceased by his wife of 54 years, Joan (Carten) Williams, and his sisters Dorothy Consagra and Vivian Depew.

Once in Hudson, he worked in the sporting goods department at Walmart for a number of years, where he enjoyed meeting and talking with new people.

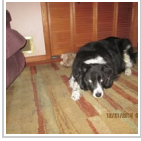
