September 9, 1933 - January 31, 2020

Jacquelyn Marston, 86, of Hollis, NH, died Friday, January 31, 2020 at her residence following a brief illness.

She was born September 9, 1933 in Boston, MA, daughter of the late Francis J. and Helen (Dickinson) Marston. She was also predeceased by one brother.

Jacquelyn was a graduate of Girls Latin High School in Boston, MA, and continued her studies at Emmanuel College, where she received a BS in Chemistry, she later joined the Sisters of Notre Dame where she taught high school math and chemistry. Upon leaving the Sisters of Notre Dame she worked as a chemist for the Food and Drug Administration.

Jacquelyn later became a Senior Software Engineer at Wang and continued her education and graduated from Boston University where she received her Masters Degree in Computer Engineering. She was later employed by several area engineering companies.

Following her retirement, she was a master gardener, volunteered with Meals on Wheels, and was a volunteer with the Emergency Food Pantry. She was an active parishioner of Parish of the Resurrection in Nashua.

Jacquelyn lived in Hollis, NH with her companion of 30 years, James Crinnion.

She is also survived by two sisters and a brother as well as several nieces and nephews.

A funeral mass will be celebrated on Wednesday, February 5th at 11am in the Parish of the Resurrection, 449 Broad St., Nashua, NH. All may meet at church. Burial will be held in the Spring.
