Julie N. (Queenan) Witt, 52, passed away on Saturday, April 6, 2024 in Hudson, NH.

Julie was born on September 10, 1971, in Seoul, South Korea. She came to the US and was placed for adoption with James and Sheila Queenan on September 6, 1973. Her adoption was finalized in Massachusetts in 1974 and she became a US citizen in November 1976 in Concord, NH.

Julie received her elementary education in the Hudson school system. She graduated from Mount Saint Mary Academy in Nashua, NH in 1989. She graduated from The College of the Holy Cross in Worcester, MA in 1993 with a BA Degree in Physics.

Julie started her career in the computer field. She was employed teaching Microsoft Office products and traveled around New England giving courses to business clients. She next worked on database analysis and design projects in Boston and Burlington, MA. Since January 2020 she has been employed by Monadnock Community Hospital in Peterborough, NH. During and after COVID, she worked remotely from home. She used her database analysis, report generating and programming skills to design specialized reports from patient data, required by the hospital and for various Federal Government reports. In 2023, she received two performance awards from the hospital for

her design work and report generating skills.

In her free time, Julie enjoyed solving Sudoku puzzles and doing jig saw puzzles and travel.

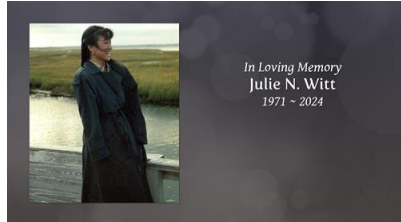
