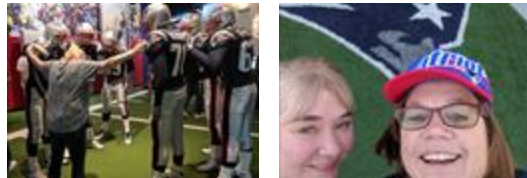

“ Memories of Juliet Daniels Gilbert
Julie Talmer Livingston

I was 21 years old when Juliet was born. I went along for the ride when her mother, a 1st cousin like a sister to me, was pregnant with her. I began to think she heard me before she decided on her birth date. I was instantly smitten with her. She was assertive and vocal from the beginning! One of the highlights of my life was caring for her at various stages of her life. I loved her deeply and she knew it. When I heard of her passing fond memories of her came flooding in. Here are a few:

I provided care for her in my home for a time shortly after birth. She liked for me to make home made donuts and she would decide on the topping, cinnamon sugar or plain sugar were her favorites. She defended her donut as she toddled around the house. She was not intimidated into sharing her donut, not even with a Great Dane three times her size. She was very independent even then. She became a golden thread in the tapestry of my life during the 53 years I knew her. She wove in and out of contact but never for too long. Her Mother kept me up to date and her Meme and Pepe also. She enjoyed going to our place at the beach with her family and was very thoughtful about Ryan learning to swim at our pool complex in Amherst. Her Dad, Grandmother Yvette, Grandfather Frank, Mother and Son were the constants in her life providing her with counsel, love, and support. She remained fiercely independent all her life. She took pride in her work but managed well the relationship between work, family, and home. I was honored when she invited me to her wedding, honored again with a request that I make her son's christening outfit from her wedding dress. She entrusted the care of her son to me a few days a week for quite some time to help with childcare expenses. What a treat. She will always warm my heart when I think of her.

We were in contact just before Thanksgiving 2023 via text. She gave no hint of her illness. Her focus was to be with her dad and family at Thanksgiving. I attach a copy of part of what she wrote. This was the last I heard from her.

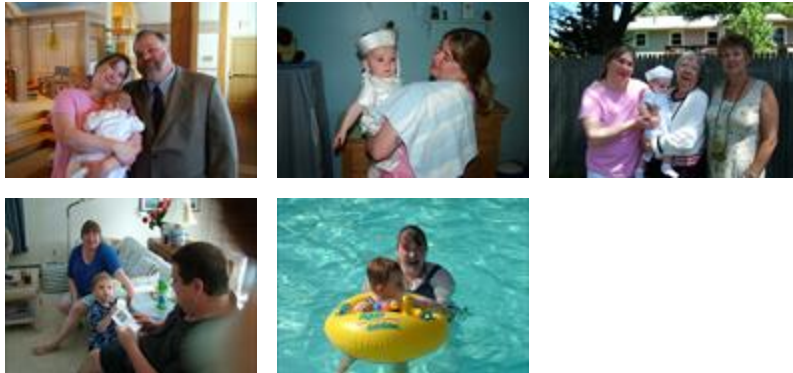
