Kenneth McKay Moore, 85, of Hudson, died Friday, January 30, 2009 at Southern NH Medical Center in Nashua.

He was born August 30, 1923 in Nashua, son of the late Earl and Vesta (Harris) Moore. Ken was also predeceased by three brothers; Edwin Moore, Robert Moore, and Harold Moore, as well as by two sisters; Doris Post and Marjorie Bancroft.

Ken was the husband of Henrietta (Cayer) Moore of Hudson, with whom he shared 61 years of marriage.
