When the nice weather arrived each spring he couldn’t wait to put his front porch swing out to enjoy watching the birds.

People would describe Lee as someone who would give you the shirt off his back, never turning down anyone who asked for help. 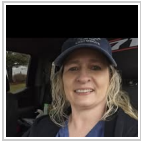
