



## Loren R. Hardy

May 18, 1942 - February 25, 2009

Loren R. Hardy, 66, died peacefully Thursday, February 25th at St. Joseph Hospital in Nashua after a courageous battle with Lewy Body Dementia.

He was born May 18, 1942 in Nashua, son of the late Robert E. and Ruth A. (Campbell) Hardy.

A longtime resident of Hudson, Loren served in the Army in the 60's and later worked as a field service engineer with Sanders Assoc. in Nashua and in Rochester, NY. He was a lifelong amateur trap shooter and one of the founding members of the Walworth Sportsman's Club in New York.

He is survived by his brother; Donald Hardy and his wife Joan Walker of Hudson. A niece; Elise Jacques and her husband Dennis and their 4 children. A nephew; Carl Hardy and his 2 children.
