Paul Stanley Yarmo, 70, a lifelong resident of Hudson, New Hampshire, passed away unexpectedly yet peacefully in his sleep on March 22, 2024. He was a beloved husband, father, grandfather, colleague, and friend, and leaves behind a legacy of love, wisdom, creativity and faith.
