Raymond L. Cummings III, 65, passed away Tuesday evening March 2, 2021 in Burlington Massachusetts, following a brief illness. He and his wife Linda Marie (Parent) Cummings were married for 39 years and together for 44 years. He was born in New Haven, Connecticut on November 6, 1955 to Louise (Currier) Cummings and the late Raymond L. Cummings, Jr..

Ray spent his childhood in Methuen, MA and attended Methuen public schools. He graduated from Northern Essex Community College in Haverhill MA. Ray was later employed at Raytheon in Lowell, MA, and later with Banktek. He retired from Hewlett Enterprises in Andover MA in 2018.
