“ In reflecting back over Mom’s life, I remember her disappointment in circumstances not allowing her to attend Brooklyn College to pursue her dream of being a teacher. During one of the many times that she had us volunteering at the church and the school, we were emptying the principal’s office at St. Catherine’s and came across old files containing the report cards of past graduates. While always telling us that she was a “good” student and we should be too, she was never more specific. With Robert’s help, we did the math and found her eighth grade report card indicating a 97 average! After 51 years on this earth, I now realize that Mom was a teacher. She taught us the importance of doing your best, the importance of education and of volunteering to help your community. It wasn’t by lecture, but by watching her example, like her years of driving to Nyack to work in the hospital thrift shop as a volunteer or having the patience to work night after night to help me finally get my “b”s and my “d”s straight when learning to write. She taught us to have confidence in ourselves because she did, and to be proud of yourself and your siblings because being a Rosentel meant something special. She taught us by example how you can love and respect your better half through good times and bad and in sickness and health. We are in awe of the 56 years of marriage that she and my Dad shared. They showed the rest of us how it is done. She taught us what good parenting was all about, and only after we had our own kids do we appreciate how it is not so easy! She always showed us the tremendous pride a parent or grandparent can have and how it is the best title in the world. I have had the benefit of over 17 years of formal education, but I have never had a better teacher!
