After high school, he enlisted in the Marines, served as a Sargent for 3 years. As a Marine, he was awarded the National Defense Service Award. Bill was proud and honored to serve the USA as a Marine.

When returning home from the Marines, he attended Husson University where he received a Bachelor's Degree in Accounting.

While attending a local summer dance in Augusta, Maine, he met the love of his life Anastasia (Ann). They married in 1960 and recently celebrated 61years together.

Bill was a long-time employee of Brockway-Smith Company in North Andover, MA where he was the company's Controller.

Bill was a beloved husband, father, and friend. He enjoyed being with his family, and was sports enthusiast, watching Patriots, Red Sox games, and golf matches. He participated in the Senior Olympics at age 80, where he won a Gold medal for Pickle Ball. Bill was an avid reader of historical events.
