August 31, 1928 - March 18, 2022

Ruth Louise (Kenyon) Forrence Servant, passed peacefully on March 18, 2022 at 93 years of age. She was born in Methuen, MA on August 31, 1928, daughter of the late George D. and Edna A. (Richardson) Kenyon.

She was predeceased by her husband, John A. Forrence, Sr. with whom she had five beautiful children with. She was later predeceased by her second husband, Norman Servant. Ruth was also predeceased her brother George E. Kenyon and his wife Carol (Riddle) and brother-in-law Harold VanVliet.

Ruth attended public schools in Methuen, graduating from Tenney High School.

She grew up on the family farm, working in the barn and fields right beside her father. She developed a respect for hard work which carried throughout her life.

She had been employed by the former Hudson Water Company as a Meter Reader. She loved chatting with people on her route and talking about their children, grandchildren & their gardens. She loved the quick glimpses of other people's lives.

Ruth was later employed with First Student Transportation for the Hudson School District as a bus driver for over 25 years. Kids on her routes knew she

had strict expectations. You followed the rules or she would “turn this bus around and take you right back to school!” And she did just that several times! She transitioned later to driving the Special Needs bus route and formed many lasting relationships with those students and their parents. She was honored to receive the first NH Special Education Bus Driver of the Year award. She drove a bus to or from anywhere needed, Michigan to Maine. One of her favorites was the yearly trip with Mrs. Morey’s students to Pack Monadnock.

Ruth retired after over 30 years as a custodian at Alvirne High School. The 3rd floor was her domain until she transitioned to the new Web Palmer Center when it was added to Alvirne. She was known to submit written works responding to assignments posted on classroom bulletin boards. “Her teachers” knew she would listen as they let off a little steam at the end of the day without fear of being judged. Ruth loved to crochet and many of the new grandparents or retirees among the Alvirne staff were gifted a hand-crocheted blanket to celebrate.

She graduated (several times) from the Hudson Police Academy. Her favorite experiences being the Ride-Along, the “bad-guy” scenarios and target practice with the BIG guns! This girl could shoot! She would paint and re-paint ceramic statues that could dominate her yard. She always had a garden and didn’t mind (too much) if the chipmunks got a few more of the tomatoes than she did.

Ruth played piano and guitar and had performed publicly for several years in her teens. She loved to sing songs from Musicals, could dance the Polka, Waltz and Twist, and could even Yodel!

She had been a Board Member with the former Suburbanettes Drum and Bugle Corp and had sewn many uniforms for the competition color guard.

She would take the unpopular side of any debate. Betting against the Patriots often cost her a nickel (her maximum bet), but made each game so much more interesting.

Ruth loved to attend Birthday parties, Christmas parties, family barbecues, have lobster at the beach and breakfast, or just coffee, with longtime friends. She was a member of the Hudson Senior Center Coffee Club.

Her own 90th Birthday was one of her favorites. She was unexpectedly picked up at home in a Fire Truck and delivered to her 90th Birthday barbecue. All was fine and dandy until the Police arrived and placed her in handcuffs for disturbing the peace and having too many candles on her cake! She laughed and laughed all day!

She is survived by her 5 children: Joyce Wilcox and husband John of Hudson, NH, Jess Forrence and wife Jean of Hudson, NH, Judith Vadney and husband Michael of Nashua, NH, John Forrence Jr and fiance Patricia Young of Hudson, NH and James Forrence and wife Lori of Mont Vernon, NH.
