Shun-Ching Chow, 90 of Nashua died Thursday May 12, 2011 at St. Joseph Hospital in Nashua surrounded by his loving family.

He was born September 29, 1920 in China, son of the late King-Hou Chow and Lan-Fin Kwan Chow. He was also predeceased by a brother and a sister.

Mr. Chow was the husband of Tsun-Ming Chang Chow of Nashua with whom he shared 64 years of marriage.

“*Mr. Shun-Ching Chow was born on September 29, 1920 in the town of Pei Kwan, Shangyu County, Chekiang Province, China. When he was sixteen, he had to drop out of school to work in Shanghai to support his family. He had a passion for knowledge, however, and studied English on his own and at night school. Knowing English gave him the opportunity to move to Hong Kong with his boss's company. Shun-Ching was hardworking and loyal, choosing to work for the same boss for forty-five years before retiring, and he was also well loved by all his business associates.*

He married Miss Tsun-Ming Chang in March of 1947 in Shanghai. Together they had four children: Greer, William, Michael, and Hector. Shun-Ching practiced Tai Chi with great dedication and discipline to reach an advanced level. He lived frugally, but gave generously to his family and others, putting all his children through college in America.

In 1984, Shun-Ching and his wife moved to Cupertino, California where he intensively continued his study of English. In 1995, they moved to Irvine to be close to their daughter Greer who helped their ten years in Irvine pass blissfully. Shun-Ching and his wife moved to the Huntington Retirement Center in Nashua, New Hampshire in 2006, close by their son Michael and daughter-in-law Anita. Throughout his twenty-six years of retirement, Shun-Ching gained an interest in learning about investment and achieved a measure of success.

Shun-Ching and his wife lived independently at Huntington from 2006 to 2010. In January 2011, after having a stroke, he moved to assisted living at Kent Village in Huntington. Nevertheless, he continued to play mahjong weekly and exercised daily. Shun-Ching became ill and stayed in the hospital for more than a week. On May 11, 2011, he accepted Christ as his Lord and Savior. All his children and several grandchildren were at his bedside with him when he passed away peacefully at 9:30 PM on Thursday, May 12, 2011.
