July 23, 1976 - August 9, 2023

Stephen J. Gelineau, age 47, of Lowell, Ma, passed away on August 9, 2023, of accidental drowning while night fishing off the Hampton Beach Jetties. Tragically, he died doing what he loved best.

Born in Nashua, NH on July 23, 1976, Stephen was the beloved son of Paul and Karen (Buckley) Gelineau of Hudson, NH, and the dear brother of Kristen Gelineau and her husband, Richard, of Sydney, Australia. Stephen was looking forward to meeting his nephew, Dexter, for the first time this summer.
