Susan "Sue" Hineman Bakaian, 59 of Litchfield, died Wednesday September 21, 2011 from complications after surgery for a brain tumor. She was born in North Kingston, RI to the late E. Raymond and Phyllis (Popinski) Hineman.

Sue graduated from Milford Area High school in Milford, NH in 1970. She received her BS in Education from Keene State College in May of 1974 and her MA in Special Education from Fitchburg State.
