Thomas P. Madden U.S.M.C. Ret. CWO4, 77, of Hudson, NH died Fri. July 17, 2009 at the Courville at Nashua nursing home in Nashua.

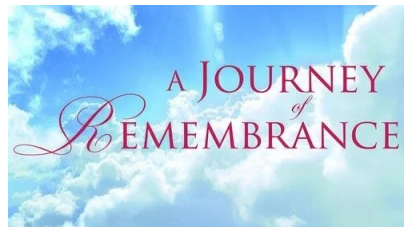
